

The national COVID emergency ended on April 10, 2023 and the public health emergency ends May 11.

This means that programs and aid related to the COVID-19 pandemic are ending.



This affects migrant workers because vaccines, tests and treatment for COVID-19 will no longer be free.



Remember, vaccination will still be required even after the end of the health emergency.

How can we prepare ourselves?

- If you haven't been vaccinated or got the bivalent booster, get vaccinated!
- **Stay informed!**
- Verify the information you have received before sharing it to other people to prevent disinformation.
- Get free tests before the end of the health emergency.
- Protect against Covid-19 by:
 - Washing your hands often
 - Getting vaccinated
 - Wearing a mask
 - Keeping a safe distance from others
- Take a COVID-19 test at home if you have symptoms or were exposed.
- Know your rights in relation to COVID-19 at work.
