
BACKGROUND

Rural communities in central Puerto Rico face yearly challenges as climate-fueled hurricane seasons endanger their health and safety. In 2017, access to clean/safe drinking water and environmental contamination was problematic after Hurricane Maria devastated communities throughout the island.



















