



What's the End of the Public Health Emergency for COVID-19?

The national COVID emergency ended on April 10, 2023
and **the public health emergency ends May 11.**

This means that programs and aid related to the COVID-19 pandemic are ending.



This affects migrant workers because vaccines, tests and treatment for COVID-19 will no longer be free.



Remember, vaccination will still be required even after the end of the health emergency.

How can we prepare ourselves?

- ✓ If you haven't been vaccinated or got the bivalent booster, **get vaccinated!**
- ✓ **Stay informed!**
- ✓ **Verify the information you have received** before sharing it to other people to prevent disinformation.
- ✓ **Get free tests** before the end of the health emergency.
- ✓ **Protect against Covid-19 by:**
 - Washing your hands often
 - Getting vaccinated
 - Wearing a mask
 - Keeping a safe distance from others
- ✓ Take a COVID-19 test at home if you have [symptoms](#) or were exposed.
- ✓ **Know your rights** in relation to COVID-19 at work.
