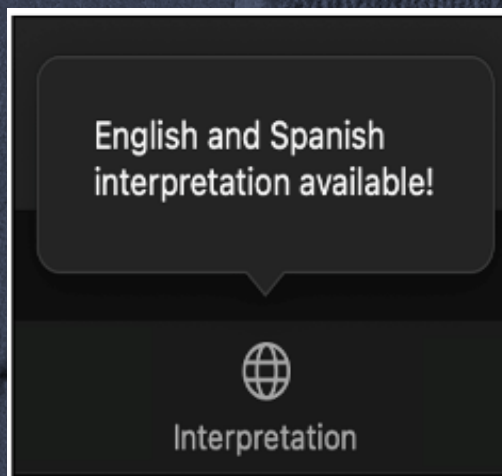
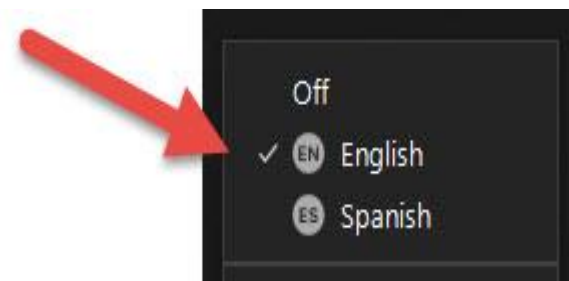

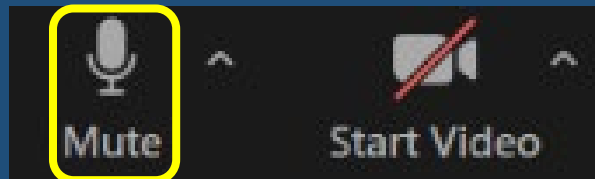

COVID-19 and Pregnant People

Personas embarazadas y COVID-19

-Risk of severe illness and hospitalization remains low

-But...greater risk of:

- Severe disease and hospitalization for unvaccinated vs. vaccinated
- Premature birth and still birth for unvaccinated vs. vaccinated

-Pregnant people are a priority for vaccination

-El riesgo de enfermedad grave y hospitalización sigue siendo bajo

-Pero... mayor riesgo de:

- Enfermedad grave y hospitalización en personas no vacunadas vs. vacunadas
- Nacimiento prematuro y muerte fetal en embarazos no vacunados vs. vacunados

-Las personas embarazadas son una prioridad para la vacunación

3rd Dose: Reminders and Timing

Recordatorios y tiempo de la 3ª dosis

-Immunocompromised

- Can be given to the immunocompromised as soon as 28 days after the second dose of Moderna or Pfizer

-Inmunocomprometidos

- Se puede administrar a los inmunocomprometidos tan pronto como 28 días después de la segunda dosis de Moderna o Pfizer

3rd Dose: Reminders and Timing

Recordatorios y tiempo de la 3ª dosis

-Only Pfizer vaccines have been approved for a 3rd dose

-6 months after 2nd dose

- Over 65
- 18 – 65 with underlying health conditions
- Occupational Exposure

-Solo las vacunas de Pfizer han sido aprobadas para una 3ª dosis

-6 meses después de la 2ª dosis

- Mayores de 65 años
- 18 – 65 con condiciones de salud subyacentes
- Exposición ocupacional

Additional Doses Modera and J&J

Dosis adicionales Modera y J&J

-Waiting on FDA approval

-Likely that a 2nd dose for J&J will be recommended

-Esperando la aprobación de la FDA

-Es probable que se recomiende una 2ª dosis para J&J

Children & Vaccines Update

Actualización de Niños y Vacunas

-FDA to meet on October 26, 2021, to consider an Emergency Use Authorization for Pfizer (children 5-11 years old)

-CDC could recommend the vaccine in an early November meeting (November 2-3, 2021)

-Pfizer BioNTech clinical trial has shown a lower dosage of the vaccine in 5-11-year-olds generates antibody levels just as strong as in teenagers and young adults

-La FDA se reunirá el 26 de octubre de 2021 para considerar una Autorización de Uso de Emergencia para Pfizer (niños de 5 a 11 años)

-Los CDC podrían recomendar la vacuna en una reunión a principios de noviembre (2-3 de noviembre de 2021)

-El ensayo clínico de Pfizer BioNTech ha demostrado que una dosis más baja de la vacuna en niños de 5 a 11 años genera niveles de anticuerpos tan fuertes como en adolescentes y adultos jóvenes.

Children & Vaccines Update

Actualización de Niños y Vacunas

- Studies show it's safe and effective
- Lower dosage is about a third of what is administered to adults
- Side effects:
 - Fever
 - Body aches
 - Sore arms
 - Similar side effects to those observed in people 16-25-years-old

- Los estudios demuestran que es seguro y eficaz
- Dosis más bajas es aproximadamente un tercio de lo que se administra a los adultos
- Efectos secundarios:
 - Fiebre
 - Dolores corporales
 - Dolor en los brazos
 - Efectos secundarios similares a los observados en personas de 16 a 25 años de edad

Flu Vaccine and COVID-19 Vaccine

Vacuna contra la influenza y vacuna contra COVID-19

-Flu and Covid-19 vaccines can be given at the same time

-Why should I get a flu vaccine?

- Influenza also kills 12,000 to 61,000 Americans every flu season (2010-2020).
- Those at risk for COVID-19 are also at risk for influenza infection
- By getting vaccinated you protect yourself and reduce the chances of infecting your vulnerable family members and friends

-Las vacunas contra la gripe y el Covid-19 se pueden administrar al mismo tiempo

-¿Por qué debo vacunarme contra la gripe?

- La influenza también mata de 12,000 a 61,000 estadounidenses cada temporada de influenza (2010-2020).
- Las personas en riesgo de COVID-19 también están en riesgo de infección por influenza
- Al vacunarse, se protege y reduce las posibilidades de infectar a sus familiares y amigos vulnerables.

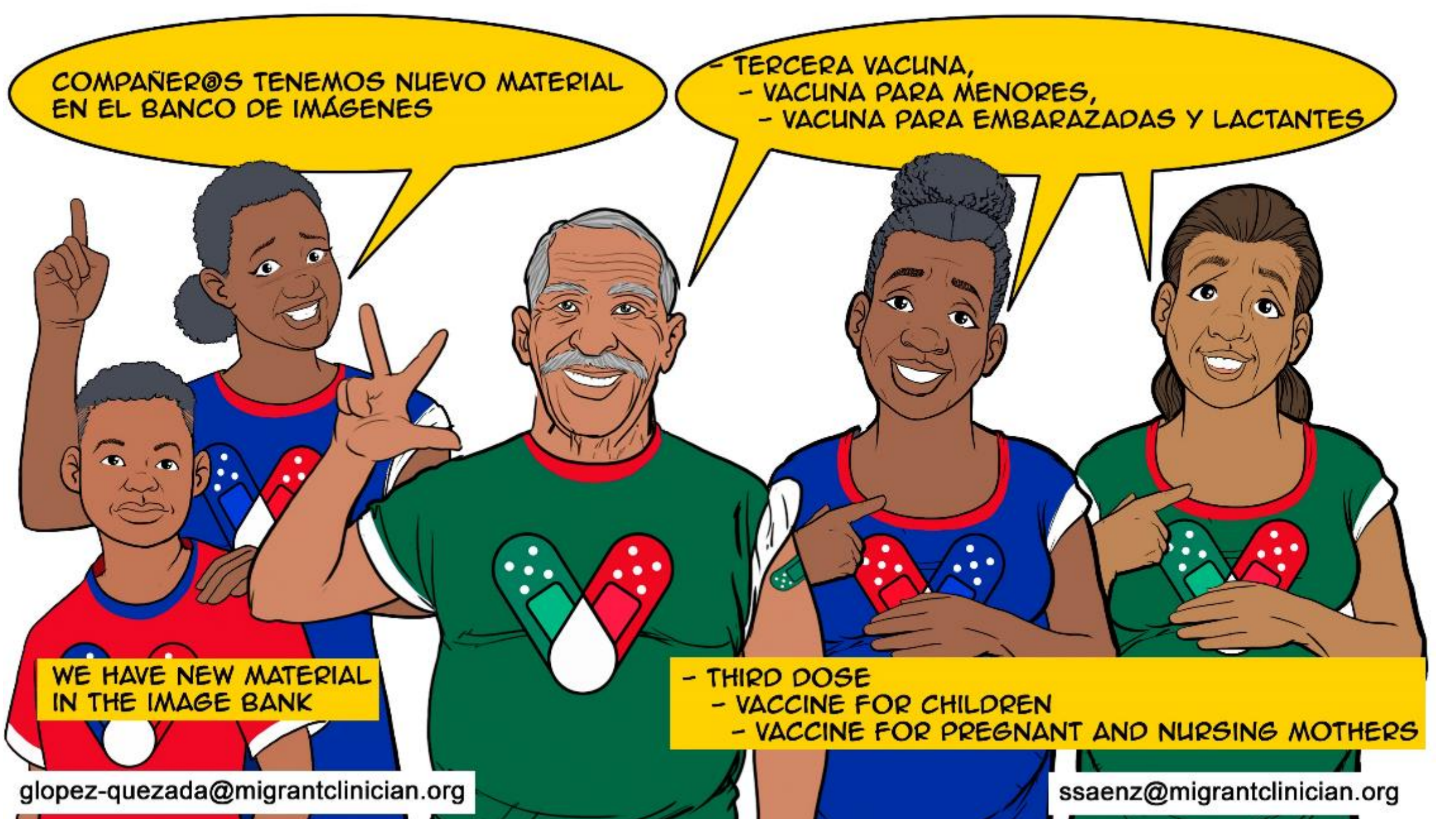

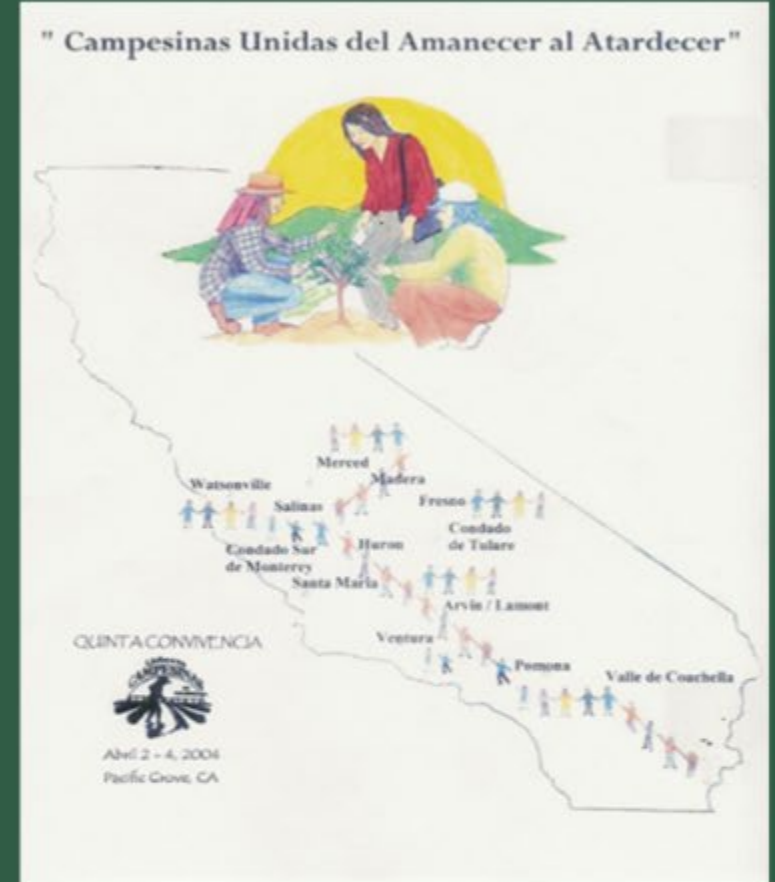

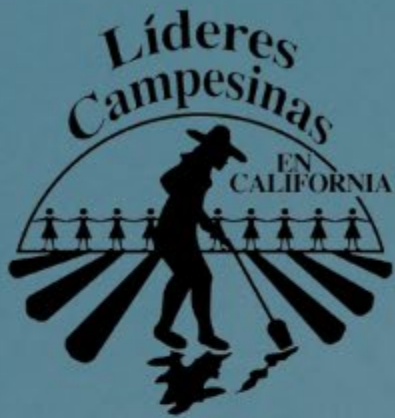

For Hernandez, the fear of catching COVID-19 is always there — and her employer's response to the pandemic isn't helping. She says she's expected to bring her own mask to work (as a volunteer with the advocacy organization Líderes Campesinas, she helped to distribute donated masks to her co-workers in the fields), and that she's "packed like sardines" with other workers as they're transported to the fields. But she keeps working because of the people who depend on her.

"All of us farmworkers are making a big sacrifice out of necessity... because of hunger, to see our family eat and have a place to live," she says.

Para Hernández, el miedo a contraer COVID-19 siempre está ahí, y la respuesta de su empleador a la pandemia no está ayudando. Ella dice que se espera que traiga su propia máscara al trabajo (como voluntaria en la organización de defensa Líderes Campesinas, ayudó a distribuir máscaras donadas a sus compañeros de trabajo en los campos) y que está "empacada como sardinas" con otros trabajadores como son transportados a los campos. Pero sigue trabajando por la gente que depende de ella.

"Todos los trabajadores agrícolas estamos haciendo un gran sacrificio por necesidad... por el hambre, para ver a nuestra familia comer y tener un lugar donde vivir", dice.

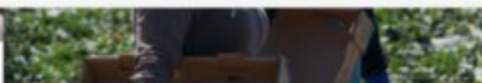

Building Trust in Vaccines by Investing in Community Workers

Creando Confianza en Vacunas Invirtiendo en la Comunidad de Agricultores



When the workers at a pistachio packing plant in California's Central Valley started falling ill last spring, they turned to Veronica Perez with questions. Ms. Perez is not a doctor or public health official - she's a trained outreach volunteer from the nonprofit Líderes Campesinas. In the past, her neighbors and coworkers might have asked her for help locating a food pantry, applying for social services, or understanding where they could get affordable medical care. This time, their questions were about COVID-19.

"Where can I get tested? How can I buy food if I miss work?" they asked Ms. Perez as the virus struck more than 150 of the plant's workers. Now, with a COVID-19 vaccine on the horizon, she's starting to hear: "Where can I get the vaccine? Am I going to have to pay for it?" and most importantly, "Is it safe?" When the time comes, Ms. Perez is the person they will need to hear say, "Yes."

Cuando los trabajadores de una planta empacadora de pistachos en el Valle Central de California comenzaron a enfermarse la primavera pasada, se dirigieron a Verónica Pérez con preguntas. La Sra. Pérez no es doctora ni funcionaria de salud pública; es una voluntaria capacitada de alcance comunitario de la organización sin fines de lucro Líderes Campesinas. En el pasado, sus vecinos y compañeros de trabajo podrían haberle pedido ayuda para ubicar una despensa de alimentos, solicitar servicios sociales o comprender dónde podían obtener atención médica asequible. Esta vez, sus preguntas fueron sobre COVID-19.

"¿Dónde puedo hacerme la prueba? ¿Cómo puedo comprar comida si faltó al trabajo? ", Le preguntaron a la Sra. Pérez cuando el virus golpeó a más de 150 trabajadores de la planta. Ahora, con una vacuna COVID-19 en el horizonte, ella comienza a escuchar: "¿Dónde puedo conseguir la vacuna? ¿Voy a tener que pagar por ello? "Y lo más importante," ¿Es seguro? "Cuando llegue el momento, la Sra. Pérez será la persona a la que tendrán que oír decir" Sí ".

Dear Governor Newsom:

On behalf of California's most vulnerable workers—many of whom have or will soon be invited to receive COVID-19 vaccinations—we first would like to thank you for seeing first hand and prioritizing frontline and essential agricultural workers. Secondly, after careful and statewide assessment of current vaccine efforts and strategies, we write to urgently request that you provide statewide guidance, standards, oversight, and regulations for the implementation of workplace vaccination programs and clinics. **Specifically, we are requesting that CBOs be part of the vaccine planning, coordination and implementation efforts regarding workers and workplace vaccination clinics all across the state before, during and after they take place.**

As you know, essential workers are at higher risk of contracting COVID-19 and dying. Líderes Campesinas is a statewide network of women farmworker leaders and their families, who have since the beginning of the pandemic been closely monitoring the situation by collecting testimonials and feedback throughout the various regions and phases of this crisis. We have partnered with so many incredible organizations statewide and in various efforts including but not limited to coalitions with growers, health professionals and advocates, campaigns for safety nets, advocacy for farmworker bills, and research studies such as the COFS (COVID-19 Farmworker Study) which confirmed with data, what we see on the ground and in our daily work. We have conducted focus groups, and have participated extensively in worldwide media coverage in order to address and respond to both the long-standing issues brought to the fore by the pandemic and those that have been affected by it. Our members and staff along with other organizations and farmworkers themselves have been on the frontlines organizing food distribution, testing, mobile health clinics, education, linkage to resources, and distribution of personal protective equipment in rural communities, as well as to the fields and packing houses.

In the past eleven months workplaces have been identified as key sites for both COVID-19 transmission and mitigation. According to research conducted by UC San Francisco, food chain workers—such as agricultural and meatpacking workers—have faced some of the state's highest increases in death. In addition, according to research by the UC Merced Community and Labor Center, immigrants' increase in death has been three times higher than that of native-born persons. One can fairly conjecture that language barriers and a more dismal access to services and resources make indigenous and immigrant populations even more at-risk.

Workplace dynamics have a powerful effect on how the COVID-19 virus spreads—not because the virus can differentiate between workplaces, certainly, but because of the causal-effect relationship of working conditions. There is a direct link between the highest risks posed by





California's Vaccination Plan Needs to Prioritize Farmworkers, Their Families and Agricultural Communities

November 2020



Introduction

California's 800,000 agricultural workers¹ are an essential workforce responsible for sustaining California's \$50 billion agricultural industry and the production of America's fresh food supply. Since the beginning of the pandemic, farmworkers have faced higher exposure to COVID-19 than other workers due to exposure in the fields, in the commute to work, and in extremely overcrowded housing that of their co-workers, families and communities.

Farmworkers fall into many high risk categories for COVID-19 and should be given the highest priority in vaccine distribution when a safe and effective one becomes available. Given the reticence and inability of California's agricultural workers to access the American healthcare system, work needs to begin now to educate farmworker communities and prepare them for the eventual vaccinations that will keep them and their communities safe.

With a large segment of Americans being hesitant to be vaccinated for COVID-19, farmworkers may be more reluctant due to concerns about the cost of vaccines, the need for two vaccinations, and their inherent distrust of the health system and public authorities. In addition, the logistical challenges of transporting, storing and making vaccines available in small, rural and impoverished communities adds to the complexity of reaching farmworkers.

It is incumbent on California to prioritize farmworkers in vaccine distribution and to have a specific plan for reaching agricultural workers and their families, to allow them to make informed decisions about vaccines, free of the well documented barriers to health equity.

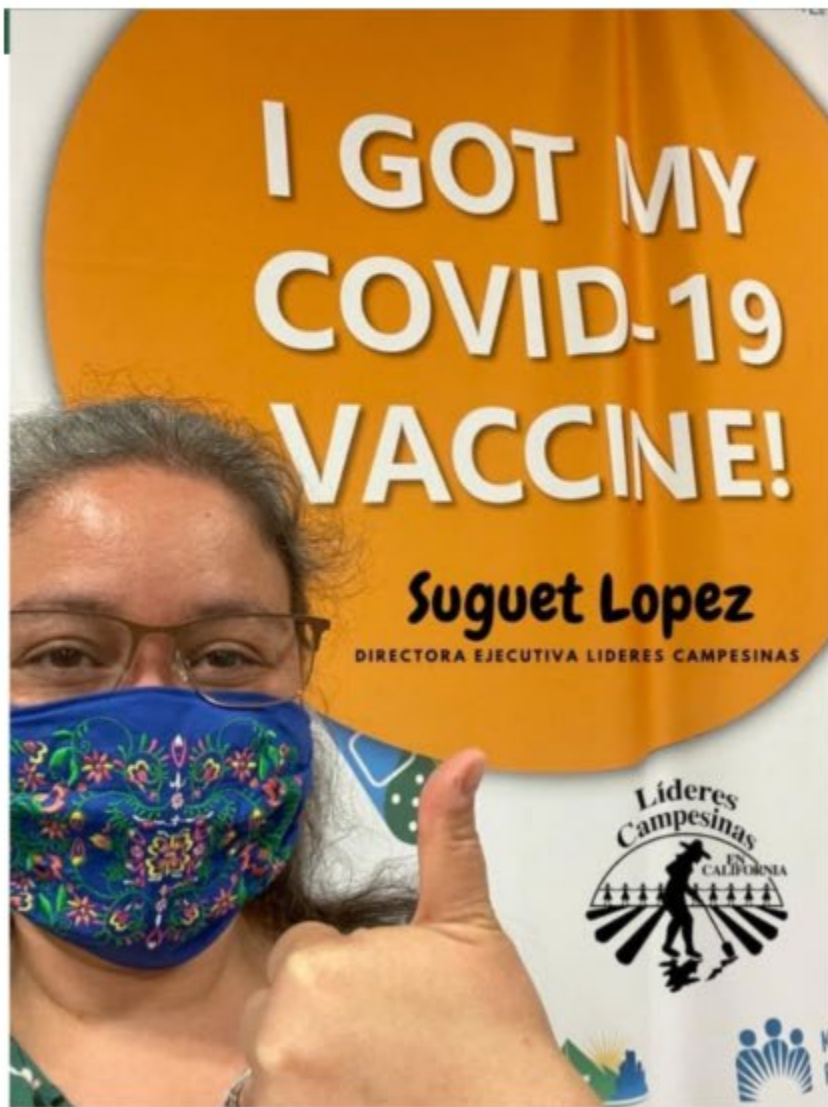

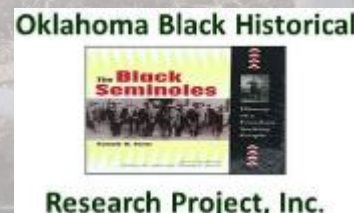

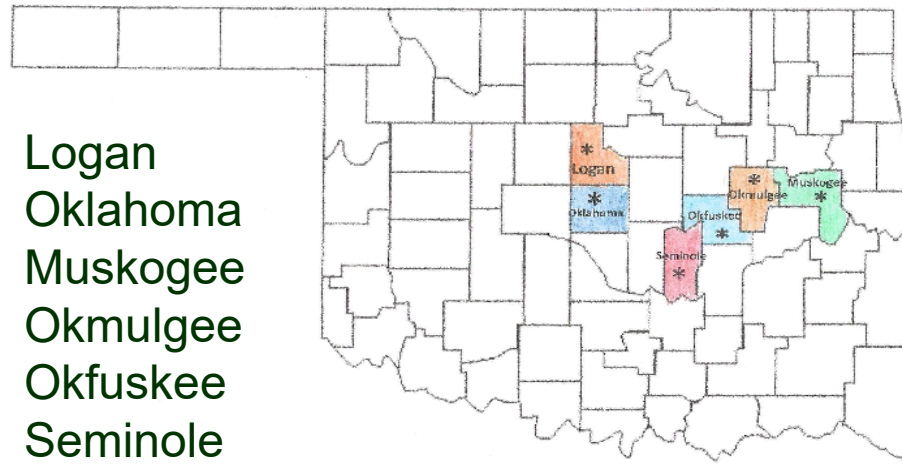

VACCINE SAFETY

Is the vaccine safe?

- The vaccines that are available to Oklahomans are safe and effective. The FDA has rigorous scientific and regulatory processes in place that ensure the safety, effectiveness and quality of COVID-19 vaccines.
- Throughout the entire process, the vaccines were evaluated for their safety and efficacy. Oklahomans should feel confident in receiving the vaccines.
- All three vaccines available to Oklahomans now have been proven highly effective to keep you from getting seriously ill, being hospitalized or dying from COVID-19.

Was the vaccine rushed?

VACCINE SCHEDULER PORTAL

Who can schedule an appointment right now?

All Oklahomans ages 12+ are eligible to schedule an appointment for the COVID-19 vaccine now. If you are 12 or older, you can receive the Pfizer vaccine. Please note, a parent or guardian must be present at the vaccination site to give consent. Please note, parent or guardian consent is required for those under 18.

- Please note that eligibility does not guarantee an appointment will be available to you. Appointment availability is solely dependent on vaccine supply in each county.

What is the difference between pre-registration and scheduling an appointment?

Pre-registration allows anyone in Oklahoma to register their contact information with the Oklahoma State Department of Health and indicate that they would like to be notified when the vaccine is available to them.

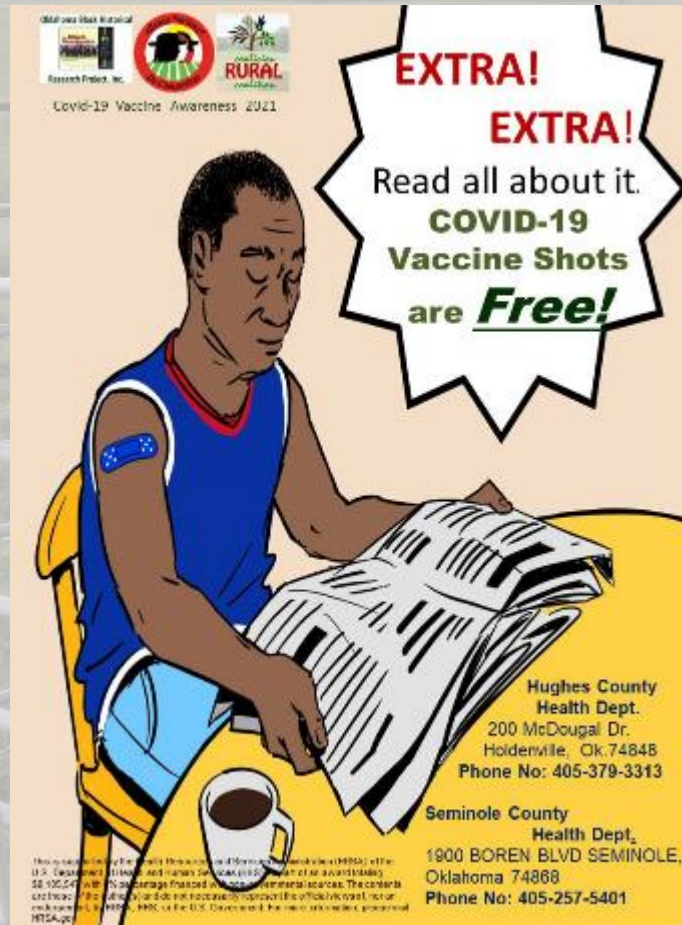
After you enter your information, if you're eligible to receive the vaccine, you will receive an email with instructions on how to schedule your appointment.
